



VOLUNTEERS NEEDED - McKinley Elementary Tutoring Program

WHEN KIDS CAN'T READ, THEY CAN'T SUCCEED

The McKinley Tutoring Program is an Early Grade Reading Initiative that helps children build the critical reading skills needed to succeed in school and life.

Through this tutoring program, we recruit, train and place community volunteers in the schools. The tutor works one-on-one with Kindergarten through third grade students during the school day to supplement the work they are doing in the classrooms.

Where will I be tutoring? All tutoring will take place at McKinley Elementary School (5520 32nd Avenue, Kenosha). The Reading Specialist will help identify suitable locations within the school for you to have a quiet, convenient location to tutor.



How much time do I need to commit and when? Tutoring sessions will last 30 minutes in the mornings for the duration of the 2017/2018 school year (November 1st 2017 through May 30th, 2018). We ask that you commit to one tutoring session per week.

Who can volunteer? We are recruiting volunteers from all walks of life and education levels. Our program will provide activities and materials for volunteers and the training and orientation sessions will provide the basic skills that you need to feel comfortable and effective as a tutor.

Tuesday, October 24th at 1:00 pm (new tutors)
Wednesday, October 25th at 1:00 pm (tutors returning for 3rd year)
